

# Admissions Policy

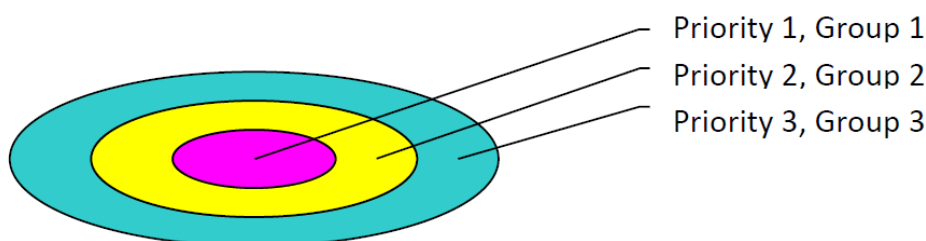


Offers year-round inclusive local play, youth and leisure opportunities through distinct services accommodating diverse children, young people and young adults. Its offer includes regular open community induction days. All its services are located at Coronation Road Playcentre Coronation Road B29 7DE.

- **Sprouts is** for beginners over four and runs from 9.30 to 11am
  - **Scamps is** the next step up and runs from 11.30 to 1.25.
  - **Smart club is** the final primary age transition group running from 2.30pm to 4.25pm
- All services run on term time Saturday's and regular holiday weekdays but not bank holidays.
- **Source is** for two age groups: young people starting secondary school and young people over sixteen. Sessions run from 10.30 to 1pm and 2pm to 4 30 pm on alternate Sundays and evenings sessions are offered in the holidays  
All bookings must be in advance with registration forms and appropriate paperwork for healthcare, epilepsy and allergies completed. Induction sessions and Meet Me booklets are used to support successful inclusion.  
Flexibility around age limits ensures best welcomes, enables friends and siblings to attend together, supports transition and access to appropriate opportunities whilst acknowledging safeguarding requirements.

Parks for Plays admissions policy supports inclusive access based on priority groups.

- **Group 1.** Children & young people with disabilities/ additional needs local to the venue
- **Group 2** Siblings, or friends of group 1 local to the venue
- **Group 3.** Children in care in the constituency



Parks for Play believes that ALL children and young people have an entitlement to consistent access to local services by local we mean less than three miles from the venue. A local service helps avoid waiting lists and long journeys whilst supporting inclusive local communities. Allocating places with limited space or restricted funds is challenging. Sessions are run with high staff ratios and small attendance numbers to ensure customised practice. This policy provides Parks for Play with guidelines, but the organisation will always consider cases on an individual needs basis. Existing attendees who have become less local to our new venue will continue to access services until they have alternatives and places at sessions may be shared to meet demand.
